

Ingo Arndt (German, born 1968)

Biography

Ingo Arndt, a luminary in the realm of nature photography, was born in Frankfurt am Main, Germany, in 1968. Since then, he has travelled around the globe for extended periods as a freelance wildlife photographer, photographing reports in which he portrays animals and their habitats.

His images, characterized by their breathtaking beauty and arresting composition, have graced the pages of prestigious publications such as National Geographic, BBC Wildlife, and GEO.



Arndt's commitment to his craft goes beyond mere aesthetics; it is driven by a profound desire to raise awareness about pressing environmental issues and inspire action towards conservation. Through his photographs, he endeavors to foster a deeper appreciation for the natural world and ignite a sense of stewardship for future generations. His picture stories "Animal Feet" and "The Pumas of Patagonia" received a "World Press Photo Award". In 2006, Ingo received the "German Award for Science Photography". In 2008 and 2012, he won the "GDT Fritz Poelking Award". In 2014, Ingo received the Correll Book Award from the University of Main, and in 2016, he was awarded the title "King of Photography" at the Power of the Image Exhibition in Datong, China. Yet, despite his acclaim, he remains grounded and steadfast in his dedication to his art and the planet he so fervently champions.

Ingo's projects are also frequently presented in the form of an exhibition in museums and other appropriate places. Ingo has also published 20 books so far, some of which have been translated into several languages.

Today, Ingo Arndt continues to traverse the globe, camera in hand, in search of the next awe-inspiring moment to immortalize through his lens. His work serves as a poignant reminder of the boundless beauty and fragility of the natural world, urging us all to tread lightly and protect the precious tapestry of life that surrounds us.
